Land Acknowledgement

Although we are worshipping in virtual space, we know that our feet are on solid ground—land that is the traditional, ancestral, and unceded territory of the Abenaki (Abenakiak), Gahnyengehhah /Mohawk and Anishnaabe (Algonquin) First Peoples. We also acknowledge that other Indigenous communities, including Inuit and Métis people, also inhabit the land upon which the Anglican Dioceses of Montreal and Ottawa stand.

It is important for us to acknowledge the land, because whether we were born here, or moved here later in our lives, we are all immigrants: we never heard the beautiful Indigenous names; Indigenous peoples were spoken of in the past tense, and the struggles they face are still spoken of as if they, too, were in the past. It is easier to deny rights if we put struggles into the past or pretend that they do not exist.

Today we recommit ourselves to join struggles against systems of oppression that have dispossessed Indigenous people of their lands and denied them their rights to self-determination .


May the living Christ lead us always on pathways of reconciliation and justice.

God's hands have molded the dry land.


Let us bow down and worship God

Judges 4:1-7

The Israelites again did what was evil in the sight of the Lord, after Ehud died. So the Lord sold them into the hand of King Jabin of Canaan, who reigned in Hazor; the commander of his army was Sisera, who lived in Harosheth-ha-goiim. Then the Israelites cried out to the Lord for help; for he had nine hundred chariots of iron, and had oppressed the Israelites cruelly twenty years.

At that time Deborah, a prophetess, wife of Lappidoth, was judging Israel. She used to sit under the palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim; and the Israelites came up to her for judgment. 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness. So then let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; for those who sleep sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night.

But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him. Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.

Then the one who had received the one talent also came forward, saying, 'Master, I knew that you were a harsh man, reaping where you did not sow, and gathering where you did not scatter seed; so I was afraid, and I went and hid your talent in the ground. Here you have what is yours.' But his master replied, 'You wicked and lazy slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'"





for the facing of this hour.


2 Lo, the hosts of evil round us
